First of all, you do not have to be a member to attend nor are you required to be a musician. All Jazz Clubs are open to the public and everyone is welcomed.

Those who join (i.e. members) receive a free copy of our monthly newsletter and are admitted to the monthly meetings for a \$7.00 donation, while non-members donate \$10.00. Since we are a 501 (c) 3 Non-profit corporation, all gifts and donations, including membership are tax deductible.

Most attendees are not musicians; they just enjoy the music, the dancing, the food, the atmosphere and the comradery of their fellow members.

The program begins at 1.00PM with the Jammers taking the stage. The Jammers are qualified musicians, admitted without a donation, who enjoy the challenge of playing with different or sometimes unknown musicians for the first time.

At about 2.30PM the Jammers call it a day and the Raffle begins. The Raffle is to augment the entry donations and help pay the feature band and rental fees to our host PCYC.

The prizes are donations from attendees and are displayed for all to see. Tickets for the Raffle are \$1.00 each or six for \$5.00. Winners can select a prize of their choice when their numbers are called.

After the Raffle the feature band takes the stage and really gets the house a rocking; that's about 3.00PM. The feature bands are professional musicians from near and far and they usually play a wide variety of Jazz music. We tell them that our members enjoy dancing so that their repertoire will keep us on the dance floor doing our thing. So, bring your dancing shoes, your best friend and lets' dance and enjoy the music.
